Your Essential Edinburgh



Key Fortress

One of the strongest fortresses in the kingdom, Edinburgh Castle has been at the centre of Scottish life for more than 900 years. It has served as a royal palace, arsenal, gun foundry,



state prison, place of safe-keeping for the Crown Jewels, and more recently as an infantry barracks.

Before you reach the Castle, pause on the esplanade, laid out in 1753 as a parade ground for troops. This was the spot where in the 16th and 17th centuries more than 300 women, accused of being witches, were burned to death at the stake.

The Medieval Town

Well established by 1100, Edinburgh was recognised as the capital of Scotland by 1350. The Old Town stretches, like a herringbone, down the ridge below the Castle with just one major street and a host of narrow closes (alleys) leading directly off it. Try walking down any of the closes and you'll soon realise how steep this ridge is!

World's First High Rise Housing

Small in size, the Old Town was contained on three sides by a wall and to the north by the waters of the Nor Loch, now Princes Street Gardens. With a rapidly increasing population and nowhere new to build, houses grew higher and higher. By the late 1600s some were reaching nine storeys or more.

Gladstone's Land, at the upper end of the Royal Mile, is one of the few old houses remaining from this period. Built in 1550 and recently restored, it will give you a good idea as to how people lived and worked in overcrowded 17th century Edinburgh.





Public Wells

Living in the Old Town had its problems. Water had to be collected from public wells, two of which you can still see, and carried up many flights of stairs. With no flush toilets, residents used to open their windows in the evening and, after shouting 'Gardyloo', tip their 'foul nuisances' into the closes below. Venture into a close and you'll get an idea of how hazardous it could be to get back to your lodging in the evening!



A New Town

The big improvement came in the late 1700s. The town council bought farmland to the north and announced a competition to build a new town there. This was won in 1766 by a 26 year old architect, James Craig. The Georgian New Town that you see today, with its wide straight streets, large open spaces and individual much houses, is as he designed it.

By the end of the 18th century most well off residents had moved north from the Old Town to the spacious New Town. Visit the Georgian




House in Charlotte Square with its large drawing room and dining room to get an excellent idea of how people once lived and entertained.


The Heart of Edinburgh

Stop outside St Giles' Edinburgh's Cathedral. principal church for over a thousand years. This is Edinburgh. the heart of Beside St Giles in Parliament original Square are the Scottish Parliament Building, completed in 1639 and in use until the Union with England in 1707. the Law Courts and the burgh's Mercat or Market Cross.

If you are a birder, look up at St Giles. This is the only place in Britain where white storks have bred. A pair built their nest on the tower in 1416. If you are a dog lover, gaze in awe at the statue of the 5th Duke of Buccleuch in front of the main entrance. He was the first person to import Labrador dogs into Britain from Canada.

Getting Around

Edinburgh has a great value, modern, reliable public transport network which makes getting around the City very easy. As the main bus operator, Lothian is dedicated to delivering an outstanding customer experience offering a City-wide network with regular travel 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Another great way of getting from one end of the city to the other is by tram. Edinburgh's tram runs from Edinburgh Airport to York Place in the east end of the city centre, with regular stops on popular places such as Princes Street and Haymarket Train Station.

If you fancy travelling further afield, Glasgow, a lively, bustling place, distinctive and full of character, is less than an hour away from



Edinburgh Waverley with trains departing every 15 mins. Or take a ride on Scotland's newest railway line, the Borders Railway. Stop off at Newtongrange for the nearby National Mining Museum, alight at Galashiels for bus and taxi connections to the surrounding Borders Towns, or stay on to the end of the line at Tweedbank and visit Abbotsford House.

The beautiful, historic city of Stirling (with its own castle to rival Edinburgh's) is 50 mins away by rail, or Falkirk (for the Falkirk Wheel and The Kelpies), Linlithgow, North Berwick and Dunfermline are all within 30/35 mins.
